MINISTER'S NOTES

Benefits of Singing

Singing is cheaper than therapy and certainly more fun than working out. It's the one activity in life where feeling better is pretty much guaranteed. Following are some of the benefits we eniov from singing:

Physically

- 1. Singing exercises our lungs.
- 2. It improves sleep.
- 3. It strengthens the heart and circulation by improving aerobic capacity.
- 4. It improves posture.
- 6. It releases pain relieving endorphins.
- 7. It strengthens the immune system.
- 8. It reduces anger, depression and anxiety.

Emotionally

- 1. Singing increases self-esteem and confidence.
- 2. It increases feelings of well-being.
- 3. It reduces stress.
- 4. It is spiritually uplifting.
- 5. It increases positive feelings.
- 6. It is healing.

Socially

- 1. Singing is a forum for sharing.
- 2. It brings people together and encourages a sense of community.
- 4. It offers the opportunity for giving and receiving positive feedback.
- 5. It is a forum for fun & laughter.
- 6. It brings people together.

Perhaps this is why God commands Christians to sing. Singing is for our own good. "Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:19). "Teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts" (Colossians 3:16).

We do not need musical instruments in order to sing to God and one another. Therefore, we choose to exclude them from worship. Entire congregational singing allows every one of us to play the instrument of our hearts and enjoy the benefits that come from singing.

Missionary Reports

Thai Tidbits

- The church at Gai-Kum in Amnart Jaroen Province held a gospel meeting March 19-21 where I preached. Revelation, a 55 year old Christian, drove his motorcycle with an attached sidecar for six hours bringing his wife, his 65 year old brother and sister-in-law to attend the meeting. Most folks will not even drive in an air-conditioned pickup truck to attend but our brother Revelation and his folks came on that old motorcycle, risking their lives and suffering the heat to come hear preaching. I was impressed.
- During the government schools' summer vacation we have seven young people come to study Bible for six weeks, the same as last year. Even though most probably will not have enough credits to graduate from KKBI they will still have more Bible knowledge than most young people do in general. We are happy to have them be part of the Bible school during their break.
- Jeiw, a Christian sister in Ubon Province, took her business friend to China and Hong Kong this past January. At the time Tu, a single 46 year old woman, was not a Christian but since they returned the relationship has been very good. Tu has been studying the Bible since then and has visited the church often on Sunday. She came to the family camp with Jiew and was baptized. It is a great joy to see a Christian sister bring her friend to Christ. Jeiw is a 2001 KKBI graduate.
